
“All Gave Some-Some Gave All”

Rules governing burial in the cemetery for Veterans of the United States
Armed Forces:


- I. Any honorably discharged veteran residing in Copley Township or the Copley-Fairlawn School district.
- II. All members of the American Legion Post 473 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 7971, regardless of residency, are eligible for burial rights in the Veteran's Section.
- III. Cremation burials will be handled as regular burials.
- IV. On August 10, 2000, the post membership, (American Legion Post 473), approved that the spouse of an honorably discharged veteran has the right to be buried in the adjacent plot next to their spouse. If the spouse of a veteran passes on first, then the burial plot next to the spouse will be reserved for the veteran. The responsibility for the “Veteran-Spouse” burial arrangements is the Copley Township Cemetery Sexton and the posts Graves Registration Officer.
- V. Only ground flush bronze, granite, or marble markers are authorized. Ground flush single or double, granite or marble bases are authorized to be placed beneath bronze markers only at the expense of the family. No bases will be authorized for granite or marble markers. Dimensions for single bases will not exceed 28” long x 16” wide x 4” thick. Double bases will not exceed 54” long by 16” wide by 4” thick. Mounting holes must be installed in the correct location on the base to accept the bronze markers. The Cemetery Sexton must be notified if a family wishes to install a base in order for the foundation to be installed accordingly.
- VI. No live plants, flowers, bushes, etc maybe planted in Veteran's Section.
- VII. The Cemetery Sexton will require veteran's DD-214 Honorable Discharge papers prior to the burial authorization. Cemetery Sexton will contact the Graves Registration Officer for authorization of burial in Veteran's Section.

VIII. Every veteran's grave is by its very nature, hallowed ground and desecration of a veteran's final resting place is an insult not only to the veteran and their family, but also to the freedoms for which they served.


