New Public Parking Lot Opens in Copley Circle

More parking! An issue at the top of our list when it comes to improvements and future development around Copley Circle. Depending upon where you are visiting in the Township there may be TOO much parking. However, many of the businesses around Copley Circle were constructed many years ago without a sufficient number of parking space to meet the demand today. Many of the properties are small lots and increasing parking footprints would greatly impact the commercial space available to them. Not to mention public events, concerts and general use by residents of Copley Circle can be difficult with no dedicated public parking or on-street parking that is remotely close. The solution? Create public parking,... ideally in a location that minimizes the impact on existing and future development around Copley Circle. Over the last year, Copley Township partnered with Copley-Fairlawn City School District to lease roughly one acre of

property at the northwest corner of the Copley Middle School. Early this summer, construction began, paid for by Federal American Rescue Plan Act dollars (ARPA), on the 85 space public parking lot with direct access to Copley Road on the south side of the circle. The project contains large underground

storage facilities and a small detention basin to contain water on-site and underground; enough storage to handle large rain events without impacting adjacent properties.. Today, this lot will help ease parking limitations faced by existing businesses on Copley and Cleveland-Massillon roads as well as provide safe, accessible parking for events at Copley Circle. In the future, new businesses or developments will be able to offer additional parking in this lot and prime space around the Circle remains available!

We are excited to announce the lot is now available for public use. We look forward to great opportunities in the future for Copley Circle!

Senior Snow Plow Program 2023

Applications for the 2023-2024 Senior Snowplow Program are being accepted! The program is available to those residents that are 65 years of age or older and reside at their Copley address year-round. The program is also available to those residents that are disabled and physically unable to remove snow.

The intent of the program is to ensure that emergency services can gain access to your property in the event of an emergency. The program is not intended as a full driveway clearing service. The Township will contract the driveway clearing services through multiple contractors. Contractors are limited to a total of 75 driveways to ensure adequate response times and clearing services.

Applications are on a first come first serve basis. Applications that are received after the maximum number of participants is reached will be placed on a waiting list until additional contractors become available.

Drivers will be dispatched to clear drives once 4 inches of snow has accumulated. Participants whose applications are

accepted are required to install adequate markers on each side of the driveway.

Fire Prevention Week Oct. 8-14, 2023

"Let's Hear it for Fire Safety"

October is Fire Prevention Month! The goal of Fire Prevention Month (and week October 8th - 14th) is to raise fire safety awareness and help protect homes and families. In 1922, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) named the second week of October Fire Prevention Week in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire in 1871. Today, we celebrate Fire Prevention Week and Month by spreading fire safety awareness and educating families, students and communities across the United States with help from our partners and local fire departments.

Winter is right around the corner and now is the time to inspect your smoke and CO alarms. Have your furnace inspected and make sure it is in good working condition. Carbon monoxide is the #1 cause of accidental poisoning in the US (CDC).

Also be prepared with fire extinguishers. Fire extinguishers help stop small fires from causing more damage and should be kept easily accessible on every level of the home, especially in the kitchen and garage.

Smoke Alarms at Home

SMOKE ALARMS ARE A KEY PART of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can get outside quickly.

SAFETY TIPS

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom. They should also be outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms. When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Current alarms on the market employ different types of technology including multi-sensing, which could include smoke and carbon monoxide combined.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, yet mitigate false alarms.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.



FACTS

- ➊ A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.
- ➋ Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level. Smoke alarms should be connected so when one sounds, they all sound. Most homes do not have this level of protection.
- ➌ Roughly 3 out of 5 fire deaths happen in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

School Resource Officers

Copley Township and the Copley-Fairlawn City Schools have entered into an agreement to provide School Resource Officers (SROs) in the High School, Middle School, and Arrowhead Elementary. This agreement takes effect now for the 2023 to 2024 school year.



School Resource Officers are sworn law enforcement officers responsible for safety and crime prevention in the schools. The Copley Police Department employs the officers who are assigned to the schools on a full-time basis. The SROs work closely with school administrators to create a safer learning environment.

The Copley Police Department and the Copley-Fairlawn Schools have traditionally worked very closely in a cooperative fashion to provide for safe school facilities that are conducive to learning. Unfortunately, the number of school shootings that have taken place in recent years have caused concern among parents for the safety of their children. The SROs are first and foremost police officers. These officers will maintain a presence in and outside of the school buildings to address any criminal matters.

However, the SROs will also make an effort to interact with students, teachers, and school administrators to establish stronger partnerships and enhance school security. The Copley Police Department continued to offer DARE instruction to students in our schools when many other area departments ended those programs years ago. We felt that the DARE program was not only providing instruction to help students say no to drugs, alcohol, and violence, but equally important helped to establish relationships between our students and police officers.

A big part of the SRO program will be to establish relationships with our students in the elementary school and continue those through the Middle and High School years. Through this interaction, we can work together to keep Copley Township one of the safest communities in northeast Ohio in which to live, work, and go to school.

Copley Police Earn an Award from the Ohio Attorney General

The Copley Police Department participates in several multi-jurisdictional partnerships to help keep Copley safe. One such partnership is the Ohio Organized Crime Investigative Commission ONSET Task Force.

ONSET is an acronym for Ohio Northeast Smuggling Enforcement Team. Copley Police, together with the United States Department of Homeland Security and the Medina and Summit County Sheriff's Departments, assign detectives to conduct investigations into the smuggling of narcotics into this area. Task force officers are investigating several groups that bring drugs into northeast Ohio from as far away as Mexico.

The ONSET Task Force has been highly successful. One goal of the task force has been to monitor the hotels throughout the area that drug couriers often use to bring drugs into our area. Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost is going to award the ONSET Task Force with the Ohio Distinguished Law Enforcement Group Achievement Award at his 2023 Law Enforcement Conference.

The Ohio Attorney General's award is well deserved. The Task Force officers have removed a large quantity of drugs and guns off of the streets in our area and worked with police departments across the country to investigate the efforts of drug cartels from outside the United States.

Zoning Resolution Update

The Zoning Resolution is a tool used to help provide stability and control over different types of land use activities. Proper planning will lead to healthy types of permitted and conditional uses within the Township. Since 2021, the Board of Trustees and Zoning Commission, have worked to improve the Zoning Resolution and have approved the following Text Amendments.

Article 4, Section 4.03

New Conditional Use: Retail as a Permitted Use in the Commercial-Neighborhood Retail District
Update to Hotel/Motel Language: New Definitions and Regulations for Extended Stay and Transient Hotels

Article 6, Section 6.01

Update to Accessory Building Regulations

Article 8

Update to Temporary Sign Regulations

Article 13, Section 13.03

New Procedures for Consideration and Approval of a Major Site Plan Notification

An Amendment to the Zoning Resolution may be initiated by A. Motion of the Township Zoning Commission, or B. Passage of a Resolution by the Copley Township Trustees and subsequent certification to the Township Zoning Commission, or C. Filing an application with the Zoning Commission by one (1) or more owners of property within the area proposed to be changed or affected by the proposed amendment to the Township Zoning Resolution.

Residents and Stakeholders are invited to join us as we undertake a review of the current Zoning Resolution. The Zoning Resolution Audit is scheduled to begin late 2023, early 2024. Community Information

Republic Services - Curbside Waste Collection

Copley Township utilizes Republic Services as the exclusive waste collection contractor for all single-family residences in the township. In addition to the 95-gallon wheeled trash cart, and 65-gallon wheeled recycling cart, residents can place up to two (2) cubic yards of waste outside of the trash carts. Items outside of the trash cart must weigh less than fifty (50) pounds.

As summer comes to a close and autumn grows near, it won't be long before the leaves begin to fall. Residents that utilize Republic Services as a source to remove their bagged leaves will need to ensure that the number of bagged leaves outside of the 95-gallon trash cart does not exceed the 2 cubic yard maximum or additional charges may be incurred.

Two (2) cubic yards is equivalent to four (4) 95-gallon trash carts which is approximately 8 – 10 bags of leaves depending on the size of the bag. If you have any questions regarding the number of bagged leaves that can be placed outside of your trash cart, please inquire with Republic Services Customer Service 1-800-247-3644.

Check Your Mail...Box!

Before we know it, the snow will be falling and the plows will be out. Fall is the perfect time to inspect your mailbox to ensure it can withstand the weight of snow that may be thrown by the plow truck. Look for deterioration of the construction materials such as rotted wood and corroded fasteners. If the structural integrity of the mailbox is compromised, your mailbox may fall victim to the weight of the heavy snow being removed from the road surface.



Motor Vehicle License Tax to Copley Township

Please remember - when renewing your annual license plate/sticker, make sure you state you live in COPLEY TOWNSHIP so the Township rightly receives its portion of the license tax fee.
