

TRUSTEES HONOR FIVE FOR HEROISM

The Copley Township Board of Trustees at its July 28th meeting honored five neighborhood heroes for rescuing a 6-year-old girl from drowning in a neighborhood pool on July 5th.

Juliana Braman was found at the bottom of the pool by her cousin Madelyn Braman. She was pulled from the pool by Madelyn's father, Brian Braman and resuscitated by neighbor Elena Gerin and Dr. Kenneth Braman. Lifeguard Kevin Karas also assisted with the efforts. Gerin teaches an advanced CPR course. Gerin said she hopes this near tragedy will raise awareness for CPR training.

Fire Levy

The Fire / EMS levy is a replacement of 3.3 mills for the purpose of purchasing necessary equipment and hiring additional staff in the Fire Department to provide fire and emergency medical services. This levy is expected to generate approximately \$1.7 million dollars each year for three years. Over the next three years, the Fire Department will use the funds to replace a 26 year old fire engine,


increase staffing levels to meet the rising demand from residents, and continue to provide the excellent level of service that the Copley community has become accustomed.

Road and Bridge Levy

The Road and Bridge levy is a 2.5 mill replacement levy which will be used to repair Township roads and bridges over the next three years. This tax will generate approximately \$1.2 million dollars each year. Some of the projects completed in the past have been:

A complete replacement of the Copley Meadows Subdivision including the concrete street, curbs and gutters; Kingsbury Trace Repaving; crack and sealing; and sealcoat on numerous roads throughout the Township. The money from this levy will allow the Township to maintain the roads with the same high standards as in the past.

TIRE DROP-OFF PROGRAM

TRUSTEES PURCHASE COPLEY COMMUNITY CENTER

The Copley Board of Trustees purchased the property at 1278 Sunset Drive, known as the Copley Community Center and owned by the Copley Community Fund, Inc., located adjacent to the Copley Police Station. The building and property consists of four parcels totaling 5.77 acres for the purchase price of \$400,000. The property will transfer to the Copley Township Board of Trustees on January 1, 2009.

Over the next couple of months, the Township Trustees will be evaluating the facilities and property to determine the best use for the Township.



HEALTHY HOUSEHOLD HABITS FOR CLEAN WATER

Below are a few ways to prevent water pollution in Copley Township.

1. Wash your car on the lawn instead of in your driveway. This prevents dirty, soapy water from entering the storm drains.
2. Check vehicles for oil, transmission or antifreeze leaks or spills.
3. Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly.
4. Sweep up yard debris instead of hosing down areas to conserve water.
5. Clean up after your pet. Leaving pet waste on the ground allows harmful bacteria to wash into storm drains and into bodies of water.
6. Drain pools, spas, and hot tubs into a sanitary line, not down the storm lines to prevent the chemicals from entering waterways. Properly store all chemicals to avoid exposure to storm water.
7. Have your septic tank pumped at least every three years to avoid failures and illicit discharges.
8. Clean painting supplies in a sink and not on the ground. Filter and reuse paint thinners when using oil-based paints. Dispose of the filtered paint properly.

SENIOR SNOW PLOW PROGRAM

The Copley Township Board of Trustees approved a Senior Snow Plow Program for the 2008-2009 winter season. To be eligible for this program you must:

- Be a Copley Township homeowner; residing in your home year round.
- Be over the age of 65 or disabled.
- Have no other person residing in the home capable of removing snow.

The first 125 eligible residents who submit an application will have the snow removed from their driveways from November 1, through April 1, 2009 at no charge. Applications are now being accepted at the Township Service Department and can be obtained on the website at:

The application can also be picked up at the Town Hall or mailed to your home.

Motor Vehicle License Tax to Copley Township

Please remember - when renewing your annual license plate/sticker, make sure you state you live in COPLEY TOWNSHIP so the Township rightly receives its portion of the license tax fee. Copley has six zip codes that range from Akron 44320, Akron 44333, Barberton 44203, Copley 44321, Norton 44203, and Wadsworth 44281. The registrar will write the city address name on your driver's license in the jurisdiction area unless you state you live in Copley Township!
