Reduce Reuse Recycle



Copley Township has made recycling a priority for our community and hope that your family does the same. There are many things that we can all do easily to **reduce, reuse and recycle** to help save the environment and your household money. This special edition of the Copley Connection is devoted to helping you get started in making changes to support recycling efforts.

All of us use energy every day - for transportation, cooking, heating and cooling rooms, manufacturing, lighting, and entertainment. The choices we make about how we use energy - turning machines off when we're not using them or choosing to buy energy efficient appliances - impact our environment and our lives.



There are many things we can do to use energy more wisely. Two main ways to save energy are **energy conservation** and **energy efficiency**. Many people think these terms mean the same thing, but they are different.

Energy conservation is any behavior that results in the use of less energy. Turning the lights off when you leave the room and recycling aluminum cans are both ways of conserving energy.

Energy efficiency is the use of technology that requires less energy to perform the same function. A compact fluorescent light bulb that uses less energy than an incandescent bulb to produce the same amount of light is an example of energy efficiency. The decision to replace an incandescent light bulb with a compact fluorescent is an example of energy conservation.

Recycling means to use something again.

- Newspapers can be used to make new newspapers.
- Aluminum cans are used to make new aluminum cans.
- Glass jars can be used to make new glass jars.

Recycling often saves energy and natural resources through conservation.

BRUSH COLLECTION

The Service Department will begin their annual brush collection for residents as follows:

September 14, 2009

Single-family homes located **EAST** of S. Cleveland-Massillon Road.

September 21, 2009

Single-family homes located **WEST** of S. Cleveland-Massillon Road.

Brush is to be placed curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the Monday in which your district is listed. Brush will be collected on your street one time only.

We will accept only tree trimmings or bushes. No grass clippings, loose leaves, dirt or garden waste will be accepted.

- Place brush UNBUNDLED on curb
- Keep the limbs within the following limitations:
 - 4" in diameter
 - 5' stacking height
 - DO NOT cut into short lengths

Copley Township will be hosting a Tire Drop Off for residents of Copley, Fairlawn and Bath on Saturday, **October 3, 2009** from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Copley Storage Yard, 3770 Copley Road (Rt. 162) next to the caboose.

We will accept old tires, used oil and antifreeze as well as used oil filters. There is no limit on the number of tires. This is a free service.

This program is for residents of the three communities only. No commercial use will be accepted. Please bring ID to show residency, such as a driver's license or utility bill.

Please remove rims from tires before dropping them off.

RECYCLING TIPS

Simple ways to recycle to save energy, money and protect our environment.

At Home

- Use one drinking glass or reusable bottle per day.
- Dump ice or leftover water on plants - not down the drain.
- Turn faucet off while brushing your teeth, shaving or washing dishes.
- Change washer's settings to reflect the appropriate size load when washing clothes.
- Reduce plastic bag usage. Take a cloth bag to the grocery store.
- Request bills, statements, newsletters, etc. to be sent electronically.
- Use old envelopes for scratch paper or notes.

At Work

- Make two-sided copies (duplex) whenever possible.
- Proofread documents on the computer screen.

- Store old documents on disk, CD-ROM to minimize hard copies.
- Communicate via electronic mail.
- Avoid cover sheets for faxes.
- Reuse file folders and envelopes and set up a "reuse station" for employees.

Transportation

- Carpool whenever possible
- Ride public transportation
- Ride your bike when possible
- Walk to errands near home or the office.

If you must drive, increase fuel efficiency by consolidating trips, avoid sudden starts or stops and remove unnecessary weight from your car. Not only will you save on carbon emissions, but you'll save on the cost of operating your vehicle as well.

Use compact fluorescent bulbs

Take advantage of natural daylight

Wash clothes in cold water
