Copley Named 2018 Tree City USA

Copley Township, OH, was named a 2018 Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management.

Copley achieved Tree City USA recognition for the first time by meeting the program's four requirements: a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation. Copley is one of only four Township's recognized as a Tree City USA in the state of Ohio.

The Copley Township Architectural Review Board, under chair Joe Gregory, began work on the Tree City USA application in early 2018. The ARB wanted to recognize the efforts being made in the Township to preserve and protect trees on many levels. The work included support of the Board of Trustees who officially proclaimed Arbor Day for the Township and passed a resolution declaring the importance of the maintenance and care of public trees, the support of the Township Service Department in the care and maintenance of public trees, and recognizing the Gregory Family and Arrowhead Elementary who work tirelessly to make our Arbor Day events a success.

"Tree City USA communities see the impact an urban forest has in a community first hand," said Dan Lambe, president of the Arbor Day Foundation.

Additionally, recognition brings residents together and creates a sense of community pride, whether its through volunteer engagement or public education.

Trees provide multiple benefits to a community when properly planted and maintained. They help to improve the visual appeal of a neighborhood, increase property values, reduce home cooling costs, remove air pollutants and provide wildlife habitat, among many other benefits.

Recycle Center

RECYCLE CENTER

Due to recent changes in the recycling industry and the continual trash contamination, the days and hours of the Recycle Center have changed. In addition a Monitor will be present to inspect all items brought for disposal to ensure only the correct items are deposited. Days and hours will be Thursday 3pm – 7pm in order to accommodate those who use the center after hours, and Friday & Saturday 9am – 1pm for those who use it during the day. The route of entry to the center will also change to avoid any congestion that would block the Police Dept driveway. All vehicles are to continue down Sunset Drive towards the soccer field and bear to the left to approach the center by the paper & cardboard containers. Vehicles will be required to form a queue line.

Habits are hard to break but users must be diligent to check everything they bring to the facility to ensure it is on the accepted item list. This is very important because unaccepted items deposited in the containers are considered trash and result in the load becoming contaminated. Contaminated loads will be refused by recycle companies and will be taken to a landfill and that defeats the purpose of the facility. Please take the time to read the following list and only bring those items to the center. Please – No Exceptions. Flyers are available at the facility as well as guide signs to help you make the right choice. Any questions may be directed to the Monitor. Thank you for your cooperation.



Commingle Container

#1 & #2 plastics ONLY –

Check all items for these two numbers - #3-#7 no longer accepted (These items are slowly being phased out by recycling companies)

Glass bottles and jars ONLY (brown, clear, green)

Steel food cans ONLY (steel, tin, bimetal)

Aseptic cartons ONLY (milk, juice, half & half, etc)

NO OTHER ITEMS ARE ACCEPTED.

Items with no visible recycle number are not recyclable.

Aluminum Can Container

Aluminum cans ONLY - Proceeds from these cans are donated to Akron Children's Hospital Aluminum Cans for Burned Children (ACBC) campaign. Trash decreases the amount donated for this important cause.

Paper/Cardboard Container

Newspaper, paper, magazines & catalogs, paperback books, junk mail, office & school papers, calendars, chip board or fiber board (cereal boxes, pop cartons, etc.), envelopes (with or without windows), phone books, paperback books

Aseptic cartons (milk, juice, half & half, etc)

Hardbound books are allowed but must have the covers removed. Toss those in the trash.

Corrugated cardboard only – Please break down and flatten all boxes.

Reflections from Copley Middle School Students in the Year 2000

Who remembers Y2K? A reference check from World Atlas.com, "Computer systems were going to stop working on December 31, 1999 at midnight. Why? Because in the 1960s and 1970s, when computer engineers worked on complex computer programs, they used two-digit codes to represent the year. The first two digits were left out. For example, instead of coding "1960", they just used "60". The main reason for leaving out the first two digits was to save on storage space which was too costly. Banking institutions which relied on software programs to calculate daily interest were at risk of system failure. As a result, stock prices of banking institutions dropped in value as the year 2000 neared. Transport systems were also affected especially in the airline business whose operations depend on accurate time and date. There were rumors that planes would drop from the sky when clocks turned to midnight on 31st Dec 1999. This led travelers to avoid the airport on New Year's Eve. Hospitals, power plants, and government organizations were not spared from the threats either."

Florence "Helena" Sturkey was the 7th and 8th Grade Language Arts teacher at Copley Middle School. With all the hype about the coming Millennium, Miss Sturkey challenged her students to reflect on their lives thus far. Ever the taskmaster, Miss Sturkey turned the mystery of the unknown into a class project for both grade levels. Written reflections from 12, 13 and 14 year-old students born between 1985-1987 were the result. Miss Sturkey placed the students' papers along with personal, historical, news items, writing samples and school and sporting events of 1999 in a Time Capsule that she kept at her home.

Sadly, Florence Helena Sturkey passed away too soon on April 16, 2013. Her family donated the time capsule to the Copley Historical Society in Miss Sturkey's memory suggesting contacting her former students to open the time capsule.

As this year is Copley's Bicentennial it is only fitting to do just that. So, on Heritage Day Sunday, August 4, 2019 before the Sunday evening concert, we will open the time capsule and honor Ms. Sturkey's memory.
