Frequently Asked Questions

As a way to prevent the same questions from being asked over and over, FAQ's have become a form of contemporary literature - an art form created from the Internet. Today, you can find them popping up everywhere. Here are some of our "Frequently Asked Questions" and answers, just because...You Asked!

Q: How can I dispose of an old American Flag?

A: Residents of the Copley/Fairlawn area have a location to drop off their worn or torn American Flags with the knowledge that they will be properly retired at an appropriate ceremony. The drop box is located at the Copley Veterans Post at 3255 Copley Road in Copley.

Q: Where can I dispose of old prescription drugs?

A: There is a drop box in the police department parking lot where you can drop off your old prescriptions and over the counter medications. **No needles please! For syringe disposal call 330-926-5600.**

Q: Can I donate my old prescription or reading glasses?

A: Yes, The Copley Lions Club has a container at the town hall where you can drop off your old glasses, Mon-Fri, 8am-4pm.

Q: Does Copley have a Recycle Center where I can drop off my recyclables?

A: Yes, Copley Recycle Center is located at 1280 Sunset Drive next to the Police Department. The center is for all Township residents and businesses that want to recycle but may not have an avenue to do so.

Q: Does Copley have a leaf pick up in the fall?

A: Unfortunately we do not, but we do have a Brush Pick Up in September for tree branches.

Q: Does Copley have a city income tax?

A: No, Copley is a Township so there is no local income tax. Individuals working for an employer located within the Joint Economic Development District (JEDD) with the City of Akron will pay a 2.25% employment tax that is submitted to the City of Akron by the employer.

Service Department News

2014 Year End Totals for the Copley Township Recycle Center

Plastics #1 - #7, glass bottles & jars, steel food containers

- 27,539 pounds (13.76 tons). When these items are collected together they're called "commingle recyclables". 200 lbs. of commingle per cubic yard - 10 cubic yards per ton - 1376 cubic yards of landfill space saved.

Paper Products - 109,836 pounds (54.91 tons) - One ton of recycled paper saves 17 trees. In 2014, the Recycle Center saved 933 trees and saved 181.2 cubic yards of landfill space. Paper weighs more than commingle so there are fewer cubic yards (3.3) per ton.

Aluminum Cans - 4160 pounds (2.08 tons) How many aluminum cans does it take to weigh 2.08 tons? The average 12 ounce drink can weighs about 14 grams (empty of course) and 450 grams = 1 pound so $450 \div 14 = 32.14$ cans per pound x 4160 pounds = 133,702.4 cans! Wow! Lay those cans end to end and they would stretch nearly 9.5 miles! That's about the same distance from the Gazebo in Copley Circle to the Gazebo in the center of Wadsworth.

The totals above are for the Recycle Center alone but we know the actual totals being recycled from within the Township are a much higher number due to our conscientious residents who recycle weekly through their trash haulers. This newsletter is distributed to about 7900 addresses so if each of those addresses recycled just one pound of commingle, paper, and aluminum cans combined on a weekly basis, an additional 410,800 pounds of materials from our community would not go to landfills. That's incredible. Recycling works and it does make a huge difference. So, remember - REDUCE! REUSE! RECYCLE!

2014 Annual Tire & Used Oil Collection Day Totals

Tires - 3/40 cubic yard containers
Used Oil - 375 gallons
E-Waste - 5669 pounds (2.83 tons)
Document Shredding - 4769 pounds (2.38 tons)
Batteries - 43 of different recyclable types

Road & Bridge Funding

The Ohio Revised Code mandates the Road & Bridge funding to be used solely for the maintenance of township roadways and allows for the purchase of equipment and materials for that purpose. It cannot be used for any other purpose such as building maintenance or cemetery operations. If you are curious about how the Road & Bridge fund is spent, the totals of the road projects from 2014, including snow and ice control, are below.
