Police Executive Leadership College

Sergeant Eric Goodwin recently graduated from the 58th session of the Police Executive Leadership College in Columbus, Ohio. The Police Executive Leadership College (PELC) is a three-month course presenting key executive leadership topics. It is based on the premise that leadership skills can be learned and that given the opportunity for feedback and practice, executives can substantially improve their abilities to lead.

PELC provides executives with one of those rare moments in their professional careers to learn how to practically apply leadership concepts. It is an intensive learning experience focused on leadership skills vital to long term personal success and change in the organization - both for the benefit of the community.

PELC graduates are making a difference in over 279 communities across Ohio, Indiana and Kentucky. Over 1,700 law enforcement executives have completed the program. Copley Police Sergeant Jack Simone also graduated from PELC in 2010.

Vial of Life Program

The Copley Fire Department offers to all residents the option to participate in **The Vial of Life** program. This program provides Paramedics access to pertinent medical information such as current medications, medical conditions, allergies to medications or any other special considerations which may be needed during a medical emergency.

To participate in this program you must fill out a one-page questionnaire containing demographic information, current medications, past medical conditions, allergies to medications and



any special considerations which may assist the paramedics. This information is then placed into a small plastic bottle which is stored inside the refrigerator. In the event you cannot communicate accurately or become unconscious, paramedics are trained to check the refrigerator for this important information.

Copley's 2.50 mill Road Levy on the Ballot in November

Each year, Copley property owners pay \$80 in taxes per \$100,000 valuation on their homes for seven employees supervised by one service director to take care of snow and ice control; roadside ditching; storm line repair; install and replace driveway culvert pipes; maintain existing drainage systems; install and maintain all township roadway signs; and tree trimming as required by state law to ensure proper sight distance on 56.86 miles (113.76 lane miles) of Copley Township's roadways. DID YOU KNOW?

As of October 2009, you are now required to have the headlights of the vehicle you are driving turned on whenever the vehicle wipers are being used because of precipitation on the windshield. Ohio law also states the headlights are to be on from sunset to sunrise and at any time there is insufficient natural light or unfavorable atmospheric conditions.

Remember, the headlights on your car are to allow you to illuminate what is down the road, but more importantly it allows other drivers and pedestrians to see you. Turn your headlights on and be a safe, defensive driver!

Summer Safety Tips

With the arrival of summer, families will be spending their days outside enjoying the warm weather and the fun that comes with it. Here are a few tips to keep you safe from the heat:

- Drink plenty of fluids.
- If you must exercise, drink 2 to 4 glasses of non-alcoholic fluid each hour.
- Avoid very cold drinks; they may cause stomach cramps.

Limit strenuous outdoor activities to the morning or evening hours to avoid the heat of the afternoon. Wear loose fitting, lightweight, and light colored clothing. Monitor children and the elderly because they are more sensitive to heat exhaustion. Signs of heat exhaustion include:

- Heavy sweating
- Paleness
- Muscle cramps
- Dizziness, weakness, headache and fainting

If any of the above symptoms appear, cool the person using air conditioning, cool shower/bath or shade, rest and drink cool fluids. If the person is unable to cool off, symptoms are severe, or there is no relief after 1 hour of rest, seek immediate medical attention.

Summit County Emergency Notification System

Receive alerts about emergencies by signing up for Summit County Emergency Notifications. This emergency notification system enables the County to provide you with critical information quickly in a variety of situations, such as unexpected road closures, missing persons, and evacuation of buildings or neighborhoods.

You will receive time-sensitive messages wherever you specify, such as your home, cell, or business phone, email, text messages, hearing impaired receiving devices, and more.

Annual Brush Collection Program

The Service Department will begin their annual brush collection for Copley Township residents as follows:

District 1: For all single-family homes located east of S. Cleveland-Massilon Road, pick-up begins September 12, 2011.

District 2: For all single-family homes located west of S. Cleveland-Massilon Road, pick-up begins September 19, 2011.

Please place brush curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the Monday in which your district is listed. Brush material consists of tree trimmings or bushes and DOES NOT include grass clippings, loose leaves, dirt or garden waste.

Place brush material, UNBUNDLED, on curb (please do not place brush in ditches or on roads.)

Senior Snow Plow Program

The Copley Township Board of Trustees approved the Senior Snow Plow Program for the 2011-2012 winter season. This program is open to year-long residents of Copley who are over the age of 65 and have no other persons living in the home who can remove the snow or are physically disabled.

Eligible residents who submit an application will have the snow removed from their driveway from November 1, 2011 through April 1, 2012 at no charge. Contractors will plow the snow when it reaches 4" or more. Driveways will only be plowed once in a 24-hour period.

Applications are now being accepted at the Copley Service Department and can be obtained on the website at www.copley.oh.us. Applications can also be picked up at the Town Hall or mailed to your home.

Tire Drop Off Program

2011 Road Projects

In an attempt to save on the cost of road maintenance, Copley Township has decided to piggy-back its 2011 Road Program onto the 2011 Summit County Road Program. Any Summit County community may participate in the county program which should increase the buying power for all by lowering unit pricing. Copley included 448 asphalt repairs on Conestoga Trail (west of Hametown Rd), Westmont Blvd., Westview Dr., and a portion of Greensfield Lane, Silver Ridge, and Spruce Run. North Plainview Drive will receive a 409 Seal Coat. The remaining portion of Greensfield Lane (not included in the 448 asphalt repairs) and Greensfield Circle will be crack sealed as well as all the roads in the West Ridge Estates allotment. Also included is the annual road striping program which will be performed in the autumn months so the striping is visible during winter.



Total cost for all four projects is estimated at \$337,317 and it is anticipated the actual cost will be less. Bids were advertised in May and opened on June 1st & 2nd. Please remember to be cautious when driving through any construction zone.

Motor Vehicle License Tax to Copley Township

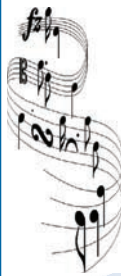
