ONSET TASK FORCE

The Copley Police Department is a member of the Ohio Organized Crime Commission ONSET Task Force. ONSET stands for Ohio-Northeast Smuggling Enforcement Team and is a joint effort between the Copley Police Department, the Medina and Summit County Sheriff's Departments, and the US Department of Homeland Security. Representatives from each of these agencies work together to investigate a variety of crimes. They focus most of their effort on drug couriers transporting large quantities of drugs into this area from outside the country and Human Trafficking operations.

The team members focus on narcotics coming into the area through the local airports and the interstate highway system. Particular attention is given to the hotels where drug couriers often make quick overnight stops to drop off drugs and pick up money.

The ONSET Task Force just started in early 2020 and Copley became a partner at its inception. The task force has been highly successful seizing \$ 2.2 million in cash, a significant amount of drugs, 44 firearms, and have made about 80 arrests, in a little over one year of operation.

The task force has seized Cocaine, Heroin, Methamphetamine, Fentanyl, Opiate pills, Marijuana, and miscellaneous other drugs. By working with our law enforcement partners, the Copley Police Department has taken a significant amount of drugs off the streets of Medina and Summit Counties to protect our communities. These seizures of narcotics help to reduce the drugs that might find their way into the hands of our children.
